Happy New Year! As the calendar turns to January 2026, we naturally think about making resolutions—aiming for better health, better habits, and overall improvement.

But for us as United Methodists, our annual resolutions must be rooted in something deeper: the lifelong journey toward holiness.

This January, I invite you to start the year with the ultimate goal firmly in sight: Sanctification.

John Wesley taught us that God's grace is not just about our initial forgiveness (justification), but about a continuous process of growing in love and purity (sanctification). The "end in sight" for the Christian is not just getting to heaven but becoming "perfected in love" while here on earth.

This means the goal of our life is not merely to *believe* in Christ, but to *become* more like Christ. As the Apostle Paul wrote, we are called to be "conformed to the image of his Son" (Romans 8:29). This is our high calling.

If the "end in sight" is becoming a person whose heart is filled with God's perfect love, what specific steps will *you* take at the *start* of 2026?

You are called to renew your commitment to the spiritual disciplines that allow the Holy Spirit to shape and refine you.

This year, consider these three areas of commitment:

1. Diligence in Personal Grace: You can be faithful in private prayer, studying the Scriptures daily, and intentional reflection on how God is working in your life. Sanctification starts when you make time to listen to God.

2. Growth in Corporate Grace: We can actively participate in the life of the church—in worship, Holy Communion, and especially in small groups and Bible studies. Community is where iron sharpens iron, and where we learn to practice love in messy, real-time ways.

3. Holiness in Action: Ensure your serving is not just *doing* good things, but *doing* them out of a pure heart. Whether it is service inside our church or ministry outside our walls, your actions should reflect the love and compassion of a sanctified heart.

This journey is not something you accomplish by grit alone; it is powered by God's amazing, transforming grace. But you must be a willing partner.

As we enter this New Year and the season of Epiphany (Christ being revealed), allow the Spirit to reveal to you the areas of your life that still need refinement. Press on toward the high calling of holiness in 2026, keeping our glorious, ultimate "end" constantly in sight.

May God bless your pursuit of holiness.
